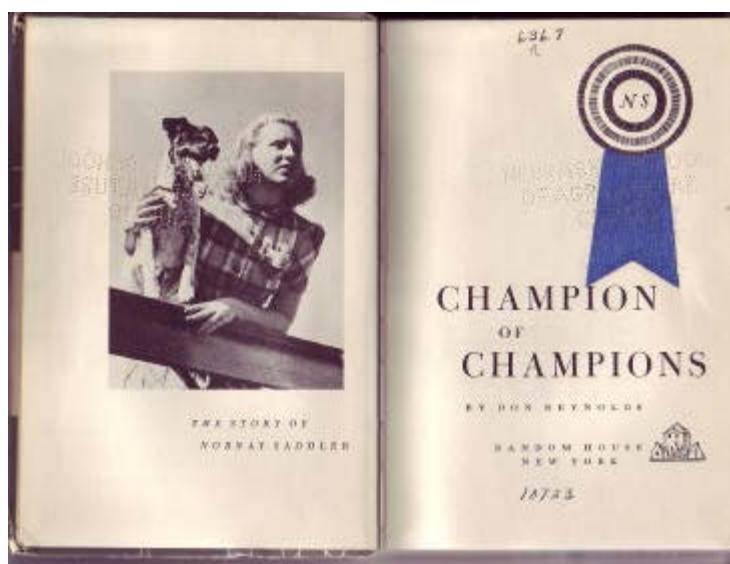


Champion of Champions
